Once again on behalf of the organizing committee, I extend a warm invitation to all of you.



Subject: Equivalence of DNB degree with MD / MS in the NMC Bill, 2017- reg.

Sir,

I am directed to refer to your letter dated 29.03.2018 on the subject cited above and to say that the clause with regard to equivalence of DNB with other PG / SS qualifications under the National Medical Commission Bill, 2017 as introduced in the Lok Sabha has been amended after considering the recommendations of the Department' – related Parliamentary Standing Committee on Health & Family Welfare made in its 109th Report. In terms of the said Bill, the DNB degree shall be equivalent to other PG / SS qualifications in all respects including for the purpose of teaching.

2. The amended clause of the NMC Bill, 2017 prescribes that the DNB qualifications when granted in a medical institution with attached hospital or in hospital with at least 500 beds, shall be equivalent in all respect to the corresponding PG/SS qualification and in all other cases, senior residency in a medical college for an additional period of one year shall be required for such qualification to be equivalent.

ANBAI Report

2017 - 2018

The Association for National Board-Accredited Institutions (ANBAI) is an apex organization of leading hospitals and medical institutions in India that are accredited by the National Board of Examinations (NBE), which administers the prestigious Diplomate National Board (DNB) and Fellow National Board (FNB) Programmes. Currently, the NBE conducts specialty and superspecialty training programs in about 72 disciplines in approximately 524 accredited institutions spread across the country.

NBE and ANBAI have initiated many projects for the betterment of DNB faculty and students. In the last seven years, ANBAI has initiated and supported many initiatives to improve the landscape of the national health sector. It has also liaised with government officials and ministers about the Medical Council of India recommendations regarding teachers eligibility qualification and the status of DNB qualification.

ANBAI has worked very closely with NBE in various areas. We are thankful to NBE for increasing the accreditation cycle to 5 years, involving more NBE institute teachers as examiners and inspectors and for initiating the externship, awarding of adjunct professor titles and formation of speciality boards. Criteria for hospital accreditation and other innovative ideas are being reviewed and discussed at NBE with inputs from ANBAI to ensure adequate number of quality professionals. ANBAI is also partnering with NBE through member hospitals to help in the online NEET process.

As an ongoing effort for seeking equivalence of DNB degrees with MD, after several meetings with PMO and Ministry of Health and Family Welfare ANBAI received a letter from the Under Secretary, Ministry of Health and Family Welfare dated 21st August 2017 that the PMO has instructed the Ministry to request MCI to provide the ministry with amendment proposal in TEQ regulations, deleting the 3 years junior residency requirement and to

specifically mention DNB along with MD/MS in academic qualifications for various faculty posts. Further meetings with PMO and Ministry is being planned.

ANBAI governing council members had several meetings with Mr Nadda, Minister of Health and Family Welfare and with the Joint Parliamentary committee to discuss the constitution and working of NMC. Mr Nadda has promised full support for equivalency of DNB with MD/MS degrees.

ANBAI has also been part of MOHFW & NITI Aayog committees to recommend ways and means to improve PG training in the country and is also exploring the possibility of starting a course in professional ethics along with AHPI & NLSIU.

The NBE faculty have been trained in healthcare communication and quality in health, the two crucial areas which do not have a place in the present medical curriculum. ANBAI is on the NBE-UNESCO Steering Committee on Teaching of Bioethics in PG Medical Education and on the Uniform Learning Resources Committee of the NBE.

Realising the importance of quality scientific resources (journals/ books etc.) in higher education in healthcare, ANBAI is trying to explore and facilitate a system, which will enable the end users and their institutions access to quality and standard content at a substantially economic price. ANBAI is collaborating with over 103 DNB Institutions and negotiating with 8 leading publishers for E-Journals to try to get significant discounts.

Another initiative under uniform learning resource is to have 'Webinars'. An extensive plan has been forwarded to NBE by ANBAI to start work on holding webinars initially in Basic Sciences to be followed in clinical fields also.

ANBAI had organised Teachers day celebration on 5th September 2017 at NBE Auditorium, New Delhi. On this occasion, awards were given to several

Several state chapters of the Association held academic activities so that ANBAI could continue to work further realise the objective of serving the society. ANBAI has started publishing its Newsletter.

The Karnataka Chapter of ANBAI led by Dr. Venkatesh Krishnamoorthy has opened as web-page for the state and is organising this year's ANBAI Teachers Day Awards 2018

On 11th Nov 2017 at AGM of ANBAI at Ganga Hospital, Coimbatore, DNB Alumni and Teachers committee was formed under the aegis of ANBAI to provide a unified voice of DNB graduates across the nation. Currently, 350 members have registered for Alumni membership from all over India. A direct payment portal has been activated at ANBAI website and at ANBAI media partner, Medical Dialogues, website.

ANBAI Co-partnered with ISCoS for SCI Day - The International Spinal Cord Injuries Day. ANBAI celebrated on 3rd September 2018 the Spinal Cord Injury day at Rajpath in New Delhi. It was attended by a huge number of wheelchair participants and the occasion was graced by Minister of Science & Technology, Dr Harsh Vardhan.

Convocation of NBE is scheduled to be held at Vigyan Bhavan, New Delhi on 21st September 2018. ANBAI have extended full support to NBE to organise this massive function where over 10000 students have qualified for the degree are likely to participate.

The plan of action for the coming year include focus on Membership drive especially for alumni, strengthen academics at State Level, expand Uniform Learning Resource, liaisoning with NBE, liaisoning with Government for parity of NBE & MCI courses and to take postgraduate medical education to international standards. ANBAI will continue to facilitate redressal of problems of member hospitals with NBE.

The partnership between NBE and ANBAI today is exemplary and characterized by collaboration and strength in teamwork for the benefit of the health sector in our country.

Uniform Knowledge Resources

It has been a busy year 2018 for NBE and ANBAI with regards to rekindling the NBE/ ANBAI uniform knowledge resources for NBE Accredited institutions. This onerous task was bestowed on the team headed by myself. The team comprised of ANBAI President Dr. Alexander Thomas, General Secretary DR. H.S. Chhabra and the Joint Secretary Dr. Sunil Sharma. This team has tirelessly worked nearly one year on behalf of all the NBE accredited institutions.

The aim of the consortia is to have a Uniform Knowledge resources across all NBE accredited institutes at an affordable cost.

To start with we collated the list of accredited institutions as per the seat matrix to find out the number of each departments across India. We did a pilot study to identify the needs of the NBE accredited institutes based on Large, Medium and Small hospitals. Based on the study a letter was sent to all the 520 institutes asking for the Letter of Intent (LOI). In Phase one 103 institutes gave their LOI or concurrence for this consortia.

We then discussed with NBE with regards to recommended books and journals as per the NBE curriculum. We were able to identify 10 major publishing houses for supply of these e-journals. The list of publishers who were included are as below:

At this juncture we would like to place on record the zeal with which the incumbent president of NBE Dr. Abijath Seth and the Executive Director Dr. Rashmikant Dave encouraged us to drive this innovative consortia.

From this point we had multiple meetings with the publishers at New Delhi and Chennai to iron out various issues. Mr. Deepak Singh representing Wiley India Pvt Ltd., was proactive in getting all the publishers to the discussion table. Though most of the publishers were very open to our needs in these discussions, we have had problems with a couple of them. We are still in process of discussion to get them on board. At every stage the participating institutes were kept in the loop and have been briefed about the developments and financial implications.

We are happy to share that a new era will dawn for the all the NBE accredited institutes on the 22nd September 2018, when this new consortia will be officially launched in the NBE/ ANBAI teachers day function at IISc Bangalore. We truly hope that this will help all the accredited institutions in achieving uniform knowledge resources at an affordable cost so as to enable them to achieve a successful programme.

DNB ALUMNI Committee Report

National DNB Alumni Co-ordinator, ANBAI

A large number of doctors, around 50,000 who are DNB qualified in Broad Specialties and Super Specialties are serving throughout our country and abroad, for the wellness and better health of mankind. In view of many issues being faced by DNB doctors and since there is no unified representation, the thought of forming a DNB ALUMNI and TEACHERS committee has creeped up.

On 11th Nov 2017 at AGM of ANBAI at Ganga Hospital, Coimbatore, DNB Alumni and Teachers committee was formed under the aegis of ANBAI to provide an unified voice for DNB pass outs across length and breadth of the nation. The primary objectives of the committee is working for the cause of DNB equivalence at par with MD and to solve other issues faced by the DNB Alumni.

Dr A. Lingaiah and Mr Govind Hari were nominated and designated as coordinators and that they will liaise with the Executive Committee with Central ANBAI for all Alumni activities. Three regional zones have been formed viz:-

- (1) NORTH ZONE for the states of Jammu & Kashmir, Haryana, Uttarakhand, Utter Pradesh, Punjab, Delhi, Himachal Pradesh, Chandigarh & Madhya Pradesh.
- **(2) CENTRAL ZONE** for the states of Andhra Pradesh, Telangana, Gujarat, West Bengal, Assam, Meghalaya, Manipur, Tripura, Mizoram, Nagaland, Bihar, Jharkhand, Chhattisgarh and Odisha.
- (3) **SOUTH ZONE** for the states of Maharashtra, Goa, Kerala, Tamilnadu and Karnataka.

The major issue related to DNB Alumni is to get equivalence of DNB degree with MD / MS / DM / Mch. In this regard ANBAI and NBE were able to get equivalence with MD/MS/DM/Mch degrees and DNB degree with certain criteria's in 2012. However, present

MCI has once again changed its stance regarding NBE degrees by amending "Minimum Qualifications

for Teachers in Medical Institutions Regulations,1998 Amended up to 8th June,2017)" where NBE institution passed out candidates need to put in extra years for being appointed as Asst. Professor whereas MCI institution passed out candidates can be appointed without the said requirement and hence it is discrimination.

Other Issues related to DNB Alumni are:-

- It is being felt that DNB degree nomenclature be changed to Master's degree as lay people are equating DNB with "Diploma" instead of "Diplomate."
- MD/DM/MS/Mch degree conferred postgraduates can simultaneously add DNB degree by just passing the Final theory and practical NBE exam. The reverse is not true for DNB degree conferred postgraduates. Either NBE should stop MCI postgraduates from appearing for DNB final exams or pursue the case with MOHFW to allow DNB postgraduates to add MCI nomenclature degrees as a feather in the cap.
- For Fresh/Renewal of a particular DNB/FNB speciality accreditation, it is observed that MCI faculty are being sent as inspectors. Hence, it is requested to send as far as possible DNB faculty as inspectors.
- To the extent possible DNB qualified candidates must be appointed as examiners not only for DNB Final practical examinations but also towards evaluation of final exam theory answer sheets.
- DNB teachers are not designated with appropriate academic ranks as Professor, Associate Professor, Asst. Professor, etc. compared to their counterparts in MCI affiliated institutions. Till date, DNB teachers are only designated as Senior Residents, Junior and Senior Consultants which seems unfair.

- Candidates possessing either DNB Broad Speciality or DNB Super Speciality degree must be utilized as DNB faculty as PG teachers even if they possess DM/Mch degree as one of their academic qualifications.
- DNB Final Practical Exams to be conducted in NBE accredited institutes only
- Time lapse between award of degree & result declaration by NBE to passed out candidates is very long.

It is decided to charge a fee of Rs 500 for annual membership and Rs 2000 for life membership. DNB Alumni committee membership form is now online & can be accessed on Anbai.org website wherein online payment is accepted. So far, 600 doctors have become the members of the Alumni Committee.

An All India DNB Alumni committee Meeting was conducted on May 26, 2018 at Yashoda Hospital, Secunderabad. The event witnessed the participation of alumni from various parts of the

country. Signature release of DNB National Alumni Life Membership card was also done. A Telegram app of All India DNB Alumni committee had been created to engage all DNB alumni in order to bypass the limitations of whatsapp group, especially related to enrolling more number of members. Medical Dialogue has been selected as our media partner on a regular basis for all DNB Alumni requirements and membership drive.

The future plans of the Alumni committee are: apart from tackling of the issues faced by the DNB Alumni, to develop a new strategy emphasizing the recent DNB passed doctors and the students who are going to pass out to become alumni members and to promote academics at State and Central level to provide uniform learning resources by liaisoning with NBE. ANBAI to act as the nodal body to promote placements of DNB qualified candidates. DNB degree holders to be considered on par with MCI degree holders for State and Central Government jobs.

Report on Academics

It is heartening to note that a few of the ANBAI chapters especially in Maharashtra, Andhra Pradesh and Telengana have continued academic activity through their academic co-ordinators. The team has submitted a detailed proposal to the NBE regarding web based teaching programme in basic sciences for post graduates of both broad based as well as speciality subjects.

The subjects included are Anatomy, Physiology, Biochemistry, Pharmacology & Pathology and the faculty would be drawn from NBE accredited institutions, from Medical colleges and also from other reputed teaching sites. Also a simple feedback system like a rating scale from 1 to 10 has been suggested to review the content based on the

feedback received and in addition a question and answer session at the end of each lecture could be used to evaluate the student.

The central team is also endeavouring to get approval for centralized library or journals in order to enable virtual sharing. This will in essence result in monetary savings, avoid duplication and ultimately more books will be available to the students for reference.

This is an important activity of ANBAI, and it is requested that all state chapters coordinate with the National academic coordinator to make this more effective and useful.

In this fast changing world, the role of the clinician has changed in his own eyes, the eyes of patients and society at large. Where once he had a demi god status, the profession is now alternately reviled as being capable of culpable homicide or treated as one to be humoured as a technophobe who needs to be guided to use whatever technology is being peddled at the moment, by whichever company has convinced the management.

It is time for us clinicians to reclaim our own space, determine for ourselves what we are, what we need, what we want to become, and let people know where we stand

It is my considered opinion that we should realize that we are scientists, applied scientists at that, though applying a rapidly changing group of basic sciences, with an imprecise understanding, born out an urgency to provide relief to patients.

We are not infallible, we are not all knowing, not only because we are human, but also because all is not known nor can it ever be. But the need to take decisions with imprecise understanding and need to learn from these decisions and their outcomes is paramount. Add to this is the effect of mind over matter and the advances in sciences and technology, the ever increasing democratization of medical knowledge grace a la "internet penetration", and the need to earn a livelihood, ours is a difficult profession to practise.

Hence we have no alternative but to approach the science of medicine, and its application to an individual patient as a scientist would. The hallmarks of a scientific approach is humility, methodicity, reiteration, belief in facts, honesty in data collection, verification of hypothesis by facts, scientific analysis and being guarded in interpretation. A dispassionate view of the paragraph above will ensure that we understand that clinical medicine is a scientific pursuit, has been, is and will always be.

We just have to realize it ourselves and let the world know.

The realization is the demystification of the clinical process and that is already underway, by the advent of evidence based medicine approaches, guideline protocols or regular audit of results.

But the importance of the neccessity to let the world know has not yet been fully appreciated. For instance the legal system does not that not all complications are due to negligence. This has important implications for the unfettered practice of clinical medicine.

I came across this interesting expansion for the word "THESIS" - True Happiness Ended Since It Started". I felt that it resonates well with what most students pursuing their post-graduation or residency in any field feel about doing their thesis work.

Leon Festinger, an American social psychologist once wrote "A man with a conviction is a hard man to change. Tell him you disagree, and he turns away. Show him facts or figures and he questions your sources. Appeal to logic and he fails to see your point".

Today we live in a world of advancing technology and an ultra-fast paced lifestyle. People communicate across continents and time zones with simple handheld devices. Information travels faster than the speed of sound. Scientific discoveries are informed to the public and shared to all stake holders in real time. This makes us doctors also vulnerable to knowledge that is changing so fast. Research is all about systematically going through this information and exploring its impact on our day to day practices. As per the Guidelines for Thesis Protocol writing issued by the National Board of Examinations; quote "The development or preparation of the Thesis Protocol by the candidate will help him in understanding the ongoing research activities in his area of interest. Further it helps in creating practical exposure to research and hence it bridges the connectivity between clinical practice and biomedical research. Such research exposure will be helpful in improving problem solving capacity, with ongoing research and implementing these findings in clinical practice". Unquote.

My talk will cover the steps in building the components of a thesis protocol and explain the importance of why we need to perform a thesis using appropriate methods needed for any research study.

TELE-EDUCATION IN MEDICINE

Objectives:

E-health is the application of information and telecommunication technology for managing and delivering health care services. We have used the tele-medicine facility to conduct academic teaching / training sessions in a tertiary care cardiac hospital. The objective of this study was to examine the feasibility, advantages and disadvantages of this method of tele-learning sessions.

Methods:

Two base cardiac hospitals with facilities of telecardiology link up were established in June 2001. These base hospitals were connected to coronary care unit facilities at six rural area settings. Patients related information (ECG, chest X-ray, echocardiography & coronary angiogram) was transmitted

over telecommunication infrastructure and was supported by video-conferencing. Having

established the tele-medicine network, the same facility was used to conduct teaching programmes. The teaching / learning session were organized twice a week between the two teaching hospitals. The success of academic session were analyzed in terms of satisfaction of the participating candidates, infrastructural difficulties, if any and the over all outcome of the programme. A questionnaire was formatted and feedback from the participants was obtained. One thousand responses were analyzed and data were tabulated.

Results:

A total of 293 academic sessions were held during the study period of three years. Presentation time was 35 minutes in each session and made on a power point. Presentations were followed by discussion. All the participants expressed satisfaction over the teaching and overall attendance was 80%.

Conclusion:

We have found that telemedicine proved to be effective in establishing communication not only between the patient & the physician but also between the teacher and the taught. Several candidates were benefited by this technology. Candidates expressed satisfaction and were content with the teaching methods adapted.
